ROCK 'N' ART 2017 Registration Form

Dates: July 10 - August 4 Mondays - Fridays 9am-4pm (extended care 8am - 5:30pm) (See below for any special hours on trip days)

Rock 'N' Art is a four-week exploration of awesome performing arts for kids aged 10 to 18! Students will hone their craft in acting, dancing, playing instruments, and singing as well as learn the art of sound recording, navigating the performance industry, and movie making. They will also work with a team of peers in a rock band and/or acting troupe. Each day will have a theme which will address a different amazing area of performing arts!

This summer camp is located at Capital Innovations Academy (1828 Tribute Rd., Suite H, Sacramento). The Rock 'N' Art Symposium at the end of camp (Sat, Aug 5 at 2PM) will be a showcase of the students' work. Location is TBA at a Sacramento coffeehouse or teen center. During Art Excursions, students will have the opportunity to see performers in action and become a part of the living arts culture of Northern California.

Participants are welcome to sign up for the complete Rock 'N' Art experience or to select specific dates/courses to attend. The first hour of each day will give students the opportunity to work on their summer reading assignments, but the rest of the day will be focused on Rockin' the Arts! *

Arts Days at CI Academy (Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, & Thursdays + Friday July 28)

On Arts Days, Rock 'N' Art will begin at 9AM and wrap at 4PM (extended care from 8AM-5:30PM is available upon request). During this time, students will take classes in music, acting, dancing, sound engineering, drumming, script writing, movie making, and more! Each day, students should bring a sack lunch. By completing the registration form, you indicate your consent for your student to participate in all activities and lessons on the Arts Days that your student attends.

Art Excursions (Fridays + Tuesday July 25):

We will be visiting a variety of entertaining and educational locations this summer! For each Arts Excursion, students should arrive with a sack lunch or money to purchase lunch. Students will be escorted by staff members and/or driven to trips by staff members and parent chaperones. By completing the registration form, you indicate your consent for your student to participate in the Arts Excursions and for your student to travel to these trips on foot or in a private car. At this time, there is NO cost difference for Arts Excursion days as opposed to Arts Days. If we end up adding a trip that is more expensive and therefore requires an extra fee, parents will be notified in advance so that they can decide whether or not they would like their student to attend.

Arts Days Course Schedule

Courses run from 9am-4pm.

Each period is 1 to 2 hours in length.

Supplies Needed by the Day:

Mondays - drum sticks + either a drum pad, hand drum, or a box that is 1-2 cubic feet Wednesdays – clothing that comfortably allows free movement (not so tight it prevents movement, not so loose it may become revealing)

Thursdays – camera or cellphone/tablet with camera feature

Fridays – see trip day description below for supplies needed

<u>ALL DAYS</u>: Students should bring their summer reading book as well as a laptop/tablet and the corresponding charger daily. Also, students should have a sack lunch (bringing money for lunch on trip days is an acceptable alternative) every day at camp. Also, do not forget to bring a water bottle! We don't want dehydrated campers.

Arts Excursions Schedule

Week 1 (Friday, July 14): Step + George Na'ope Hula Festival

Students may arrive at the normal 9am start time. Depending on movie times, we may spend some time on campus before leaving to go see <u>Step</u> (a documentary film about a high school step team in inner-city Baltimore. The characters strive to be successful in dance while also becoming the first in their family to attend college) at a theater in the Arden or downtown area (TBA once movie times & locations are announced). We will then have lunch (**students should bring a sack lunch & water or money for lunch**). Thereafter, we will head down to the Hula Festival at the Holiday Inn Capitol Plaza (300 J St). While at the festival, students will see hula performances as well as have an opportunity to browse the Hawaiian vendors for items to purchase. We will be back on the school campus at approximately 4:30pm.

Week 2 (Friday, July 21): Leonardo da Vinci "Machines in Motion"

Students may arrive at the normal 9am start time. We will leave campus at 10am to head to the Aerospace Museum of CA (3200 Freedom Park Drive McClellan, CA 95652). Forty impressive machine replicas will be on special display, occupying nearly 9,000-square foot of space inside the Museum. All of the hands-on machines are based on Leonardo da Vinci's visionary designs and innovative notebook drawings that have been meticulously constructed by a modern team of scientists and craftsmen in collaboration with the Leonardo da Vinci Museum in Florence, Italy. Museum guests will have the unique opportunity to set the machines in motion while learning and exploring the wide range of mechanical principles da Vinci employed to create each one. The exhibit features visionary early inventions such as the helicopter, glider, armored tank, drive transmission, printing press, bicycle, robot and more. **Students should bring a sack lunch & water or money for lunch.** We will be back on campus at approximately 4pm.

Week 3 (Tuesday, July 25th): State Fair

Students may arrive at the normal 9am start time. We will head to the State Fair (at Cal Expo) in time to arrive for opening at 11am. Students will enjoy the fair exhibits, performances, carnival games, food, and more. **Students must bring money for lunch, drinks, carnival games, and rides.** It can get very hot at the fair, so hydration is a must! We will be back on campus by approximately 4pm.

We will do the usual Tuesday classes on Friday this week since we will be gone at the fair for the day on Tuesday.

Week 4 (Friday, August 4th): Arts Advocacy

Students may arrive at the normal 9am start time. We will leave campus at 10am to head to the California Museum (1020 "O" Street). "Art & Advocacy" is a new exhibit of original works by developmentally-disabled artists residing across California. The exhibit seeks to challenge assumptions about people with developmental disabilities. It marks the 40th anniversary of the Lanterman Act (AB 846), the 1977 law giving developmentally disabled Californians the right to services and supports they need to live independently. **Students should bring a sack lunch & water or money for lunch.**

NOTE: We are also looking into other trips such as musical concerts which may be added to the schedule as performance dates are posted in the coming months. We will add these to the website and this registration form as information becomes available.
